

LOW DRY MATTER FODDER BEET

Proven in diverse on-farm trials, Dynamo represents the newest genetics in fodder beet breeding, boasting excellent disease and bolting tolerance. With a soft-fleshed bulb and an average dry matter of 12-14%, Dynamo is easily grazed by animals of all ages, but particularly suitable for sheep and young stock.

Its large, protruding red bulb, positioned 60%+ above ground, ensures easy grazing. Coated with insecticide and or fungicide-only options. Available in convenient 50,000 seed units.

MEDIUM DRY MATTER FODDER BEET

Coming from one of the most advanced breeding programmes in the world, Kokomo has bulbs with a low to medium dry matter content of 14-16%. Boasting a large, red tankard-shaped bulb, positioned 50%+ above ground, Kokomo ensures good disease and bolting tolerance. With large bulbs, strong foliar growth and consistently high-yielding in on-farm trials, Kokomo is suitable for grazing for sheep, cattle and deer. Coated with insecticide and or fungicide-only options. Available in convenient 50,000 seed units.

GERONIMO

MEDIUM DRY MATTER FODDER BEET

Geronimo is one of Cropmark's most reliable dry matter fodder beets and continuously performs year in and year out. Geronimo is a mono-germ cultivar with a yellow-orange tankard-shaped bulb, positioned 45% above the ground. It has consistently high yields and medium dry matter content of 16-18%, combined with large top growth, and strong tolerance to diseases Rhizomania, Ramularia and Mildew.

Ideal for sheep, cattle, and deer, Geronimo offers flexibility for in situ grazing or as a lifted, whole or chopped feed. Coated with insecticide and or fungicide-only options. Available in convenient 50,000 seed units.
